# A Busy Day Of Miraculous Healing

Mark 1:21-34; Luke 4:31-41

Mark and Luke both record the events on a very busy Sabbath day in Capernaum, when Jesus taught in the synagogue, delivered a demoniac that was in the synagogue, then went to Peter's house, and healed Peter's mother-in-law, and then that evening a multitude gathered at the door of Peter's house and Jesus healed many. Mark and Luke record each of these events, and Matthew records the healing of Peter's mother-in-law, and the healing at the door of Peter's house (Matthew 8:14-16).

#### I. THE DELIVERANCE OF A DEMONIAC IN A SYNAGOGUE

This particular event is recorded by *Mark (Mark 1:21-28)*, and by *Luke (Luke 4:31-37)*.

### 1 Jesus Teaches In A Synagogue:

The setting of this particular miracle is **Jesus** teaching in the synagogue (**Mark 1:21**; **Luke 4:31**), and both **Mark** and **Luke** record that the people "were astonished" (**Mark 1:22**; **Luke 4:32**). They were amazed at what He taught; "astonished at His doctrine" (**Mark 1:22**; **Luke 4:32**). They were astounded and stunned by His manner of teaching; "for He taught them as one that had authority, and not as the scribes" (**Mark 1:22**), "for His word was with power" (**Luke 4:32**). They were flabbergasted that what He taught, and the manner of His teaching was so unlike what they were accustomed to "and not as the scribes" (**Mark 1:22**). Through the **Gospels, Jesus** is seen often teaching (**Mark 4:2**; **6:34**; **Luke 4:15**; **5:3**; **John 7:14**; **8:2**), and people were often astonished at the teaching of **Jesus** (**Matthew 7:28**; **13:54**; **22:33**). He taught that which was **essential**, (He was not sidetracked with the trivial). He taught with great **simplicity**, with **practicality**, and with **purpose!** What **Jesus** taught, He modeled, what He did was in harmony with what He taught, and what He taught was in harmony with what He did.

#### 2 A Demon Possessed Man In The Synagogue:

Present in the synagogue where **Jesus** was teaching was "a man with an unclean spirit" (Mark 1:23), Luke describes him as a man "which had a spirit of an unclean devil" (Luke 4:33). As **Jesus** was teaching the **demon** began to cry out through the man. Luke says that he "cried out with a <u>loud</u> voice" (Luke 4:33). Both Mark and Luke record the same thing as to what the **demon** said through the man (Mark 1:24; Luke 4:34).

# O He Cried Out As One In Agony At The Presence Of **Christ:**"Let us alone; what have we to do with thee"

- He Cried Out To Belittle Christ:
  "thou Jesus of Nazareth"
- O He cried out in fear of **Christ:** "art thou come to destroy us?"
- O He Cried Out With Recognition Of The Person Of **Christ:** "I know thee who thou art; the Holy One of God"

#### 3 Christ Delivers The Man From The Demon:

**Jesus** speaks directly to the **demon** within the man, and once again, both **Mark** and **Luke** give identical details-"Hold thy peace (be quiet), and come out of him" (Mark 1:25; Luke 4:35). The **demon** then threw the man down into the midst of the assembly and cried out with a loud voice (that no doubt could be heard throughout the synagogue), and then left the man unharmed (Mark 1:26; Luke 4:35). JESUS IS SUPREME OVER DEMONIAC FORCES!

# 4 The Affect That This Had Upon The People:

The people were amazed and began to talk amongst themselves concerning what they had heard taught, and concerning what they had just witnessed. THEY STOOD AMAZED AT HIS POWER AND AUTHORITY (Mark 1:27; Luke 4:36). They began to spread abroad what they had heard and seen concerning Christ (Mark 1:28; Luke 4:37).

#### II. THE HEALING OF PETER'S MOTHER-IN-LAW

This is recorded by *Matthew (Matthew 8:14-15)*, by *Mark (Mark 1:29-31)*, and by *Luke (Luke 4:38-39)*.

#### Jesus Arrives At Peter's House:

Matthew, Mark, and Luke all record the arrival of Jesus at Peter's house. Mark and Luke record that it was immediately after leaving the synagogue where He had taught, and cast out the demon (Mark 1:29; Luke 4:38).

#### 2 Peter's Mother-In-Law In Need:

Matthew and Mark record that she was "sick (ailing), of a fever" (Matthew 8:14; Mark 1:30). Luke (being a physician) gave more detail, saying that she "was taken (overcome, and under the control), with a great (a very serious, extraordinary and very high), fever" (Luke 4:38).

#### 3 The Need Is Presented To Jesus:

Mark records "and anon (shortly after He entered the house), they tell him of her" (Mark 1:30). Out of concern and a burden for her, and with assurance that He could help her, and with hope that He would help her, they told Him of her condition. Luke records how it was that they told Him-"and they besought him for her" (Luke 4:38). They pleaded and begged on her behalf. This manifests their feeling of urgency and helplessness!

### 4 Jesus Heals Peter's Mother-In-Law:

Following them telling **Jesus** of the need, **Mark** records "And He came" no doubt to where she laid (**Mark 1:31**), and then "he saw (her), sick of a fever" (**Matthew 8:14**). Luke records that "He stood over her" (Luke 4:39). As He stood there in her presence, Luke records that He "rebuked the fever" (Luke 4:39). Matthew and Mark both record that He touched her hand (**Matthew 8:15; Mark 1:31**), and **Mark** adds "and lifted her up" (Mark 1:31). The result of all of this is; "the fever left her" (Matthew 8:15; Mark 1:31; Luke 4:39). Mark adds "immediately the fever left her" (Mark 1:31). THIS REVEALS THE POWER OF HIS PRESENCE, HIS WORD, AND HIS TOUCH!

### 5 The Manifest Evidence Of Healing:

There was outward evidence displayed that the miraculous had taken place! *Matthew* and *Luke* record that "she <u>arose</u> and <u>ministered</u> unto them" (*Matthew 8:15; Luke 4:39*), and *Mark* simply states "she <u>ministered</u> unto them" (*Mark 1:31*). HEALING, THEN SERVICE! Healed by the miraculous power of *Christ*, she had a <u>desire</u> to serve! Her service was both <u>immediate</u> and <u>appropriate!</u> HER SERVICE WAS THE MANIFESTATION THAT SHE HAD BEEN THE RECIPIENT OF THE MIRACULOUS POWER OF CHRIST!

#### III. THE HEALING OF MANY

This is recorded by *Matthew (Matthew 8:16-17)*, by *Mark (Mark 1:32-34)*, and by *Luke (Luke 4:40-41)*.

#### A Multitude Arrives At The Door Of Peter's House:

What is recorded here took place in the evening; "When the even was come" (Matthew 8:16), "And at even when the sun did set" (Mark 1:32), and "when the sun was setting" (Luke 4:40). At this time as a result of the people spreading the word about what had happened that day in the synagogue, Mark records "And all the city was gathered together at the door" (Mark 1:33). Those who had gathered did so with their sick and demon-possessed loved ones (Matthew 8:16; Mark 1:32; Luke 4:40). Having heard of how Jesus freed the demon-possessed man in the synagogue, THESE PEOPLE CAME WITH GREAT EXCITEMENT AND HOPE!

## 2 Jesus Heals Those Who Were Brought To Him:

Picture the scene at the door of **Peter's** house: There was a great variety of disease "divers diseases" (**Mark 1:34**; **Luke 4:40**), and there were those "possessed with devils" who were crying out. **Jesus** healed by **word**-"He cast out the spirits with His word" (**Matthew 8:16**), and by **touch**-"He laid His hands on every one of them, and healed them" (**Luke 4:40**). Again, THIS REVEALS THE POWER OF HIS PRESENCE, HIS WORD, AND HIS TOUCH!

In each of these miracles, mankind is pictured as a <u>needy</u> and <u>incapable</u> creature, and **Jesus** is seen in His <u>compassion</u> and <u>empathy</u>, and as the <u>all-sufficient</u>, and <u>proficient</u> One! **Jesus** is the <u>hope</u> and the <u>answer</u> to the desperate needs of mankind.
